AS WE PREPARE for January's Reno conference, we wanted to extend heartfelt thanks to some remarkable people who have so generously contributed to the education of military personnel in recent history. *Hope to see many of you in Reno!*

BARRY COBB served as director of DANTES for 24 years and an additional 10 for a total of 34 years. Barry was a frequent speaker for CCME, where he was given the highest award in 1999 – the President's Award. Previously, in 1993, he received the John Brian Award as the Outstanding Military Educator of the Year. He is replaced by Jeff Cropsey, who served until recently as the director of Navy College Programs.

JOYCE TAYLOR served for 36 years, most recently as the director of Coast Guard Voluntary Education Services. Since 1995, when she joined the Coast Guard education effort, she has worked steadily to build the Coast Guard Institute. Her 23 years with DANTES as an Education Specialist prior to the Coast Guard assignment were good preparation for the director of Coast Guard Educational Services. In 2004, Ms. Taylor was recognized as the John Brian Military Educator of the Year for CCME.

LEO PRYBYLOWSKI, now deceased, was known not only for his COMEX exhibits of CLEP, SAT and GED materials, but for his sponsorship of major CCME events at symposiums. As a result, he received recognition in the 2005 awards ceremony at the annual symposium in New Orleans. Leo was a true friend of CCME and provided annual hospitality suites each year to all participants. We will miss his dedication and contributions to our organization.

JEFF CROPSEY, former director of Navy Voluntary Education, has moved to the director's position at DANTES, where he previously served as Deputy Director. As a speaker for the Navy's education

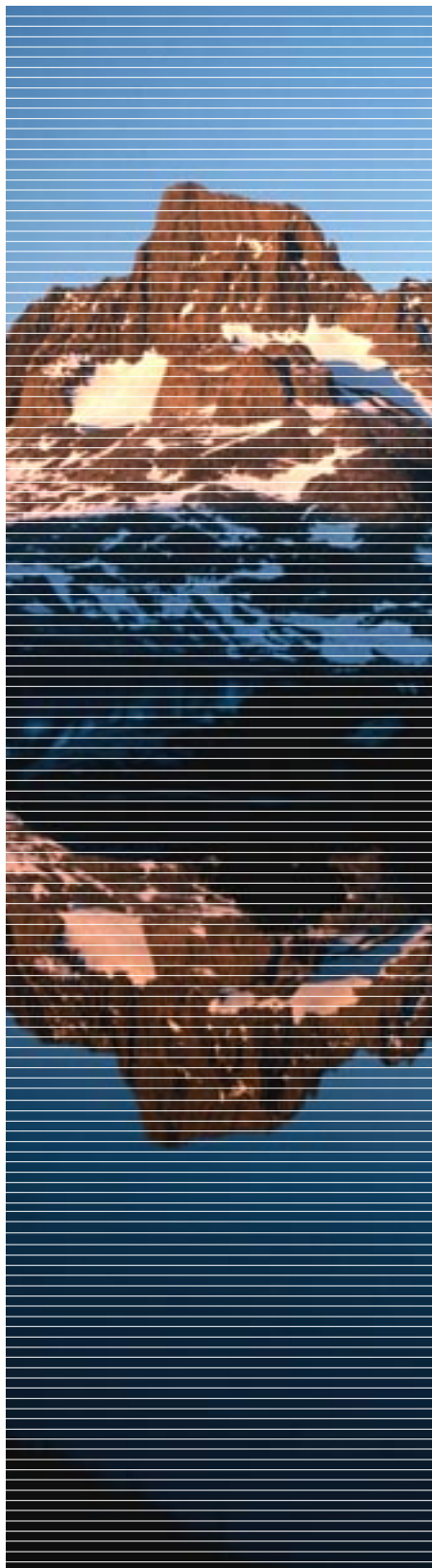
WE WILL BE OFFERING expanded concurrent sessions to accommodate the many topics that were suggested at the New Orleans Symposium.
